It's been a while since our last newsletter, but all for good reasons. Team Agromovil has been busier than ever, visiting partners in the field, expanding our world-class technology, and adding new team members to help us do more in Tanzania, Ghana, Colombia, and around the globe.

TANZANIA... FINALLY

Working over Zoom is challenging, but thanks (no thanks) to COVID it was a necessity as Team Agromovil built our first implementation in Africa with the Tanzanian Horticultural Association (TAHA) and USDA. In July – at last, after nearly 18 months of virtual work – Agromovil CEO Andrew Mack and CTO Jens Francis traveled to meet with TAHA management, technical staff, farmers and other sector leaders, including representatives of USDA, USAID and the World Food Programme in Tanzania. With meetings in Arusha, Dar es Salaam, Njombe, Mbeya as well as rural areas, we were able to speak directly with avocado and onion producers and buyers using the platform. Enthusiasm was high, as we addressed an audience of nearly 500 avocado farmers and press in Njombe. The meetings showed once again how much farmers want to be seen, and how Agromovil's simple approach to driving data at scale can help build impact for farmer support agencies and co-ops like TAHA. Thanks to the exceptional professionals at TAHA!

GHANA AND GUINNESS

In October Field Operations Manager Grace Tellez and CEO Andrew Mack traveled to Ghana to further our implementation in the country working alongside Guinness. In Ghana, the Agromovil implementation is aimed at helping building efficiency between Guinness – the major buyer of sorghum in the country – Guinness aggregators and the 30,000 farmers providing inputs to brew our favorite beer. Together with USDA's Harold Tarver and a team from the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST) led by Professor Paul Sarfo-Mensah, Agromovil held meetings in Accra and trainings in the northern cities of Larabanga and Tamale with lead farmers and aggregators. It was inspiring to watch as farmers posted goods for sale and taught each other how to use Agromovil. The platform is fun, easy and really helpful," said Mustapha, a farmer from the aggregator group Faranaya. The visit was also a chance for Agromovil to meet with new local team members.
